**CVS Caremark Charitable Trust Awards \$10,000 to  
The Miracle League of Richmond Virginia “Boundless Playground”**

Donation to the Miracle League of Richmond Virginia is part of CVS Caremark Charitable Trust’s \$4.2 million in grant funding to organizations supporting children with disabilities and those who are under-insured or uninsured.

Chesterfield, Virginia-June, 13, 2009-Miracle League of Richmond Virginia announced today that it has received a \$10,000.00 grant from the CVS Caremark Charitable Trust, the private foundation created by CVS Caremark Corporation.

The Miracle League is a national organization determined to bring the game of baseball to children with disabilities around the globe. Our first focus is to orchestrate baseball programs and to help build accessible rubberized fields so that every child has the chance to play baseball. Richmond’s Miracle League field from beginning to end took 597 days to complete and on September 15, 2007, we opened our field to 24 young baseball players and a host of “Buddies” to play on Virginia’s First Miracle Field! The Miracle League of Richmond Virginia has currently provided safe recreational play for over 500 players and volunteers.

The Miracle League of Richmond is currently fundraising to build a "Boundless Playground" on the same site with the Miracle League Baseball Field. The Boundless Playground provides a barrier-free playground area where children, with and without disabilities, can develop essential skills for life as they learn to play together. A Boundless Playground is a wonderful way to bring kids together, to eliminate bias, and to provide another opportunity for inclusion and fun!

“The Miracle League of Richmond Virginia is extremely excited to have been awarded \$10,000 from CVS Caremark Charitable Trust. Their partnership puts us one step closer to providing another safe recreational play area for our special need children in Chesterfield, Virginia.
